ROYAL DECREE 3104, DECEMBER 1, 1978
(OFFICIAL STATE BULLETIN, NO. 8, JAN. 9, 1979)

Initiative to his introduction concerned to different Spanish Universities

Order of February 24, 1981
(Official State Bulletin, No 64,
March 16, 1981),
set the guidelines for the curriculum

**REFORM OF DIPLOMA IN LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE
ROYAL DECREE 1422 ON AUGUST 30, 1991
(OFFICIAL STATE BULLETIN, NO. 243,
OCTOBER 10, 1991)**

As a result of the University Reform Act (1983)

Royal Decree 1422 established:

- The new graduate university degree in Library Science and Documentation.
- The new general guidelines (*) of his curriculum.

- BASIC REFERENCE DISCIPLINES (ARCHIVE, LIBRARY SCIENCE, GENERAL DOCUMENTATION AND BIBLIOGRAPHY)
- OTHER TECHNICAL PROCEDURES OR AN INSTRUMENTAL DIMENSION (DOCUMENTARY ANALYSIS AND LANGUAGES, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, DOCUMENTARY RESEARCH)
- PRACTICUM (AIMED AT PUTTING STUDENTS IN CONTACT WITH PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITY)

(second cycle degree, two years)

WAS ESTABLISHED BY ROYAL DECREE 912/1992, JULY 17
(OFFICIAL STATE BULLETIN, ON AUGUST 27, 1992).




Modification of European university studies

"Declaration of the Sorbonne" (May 25, 1998)



- European Higher Education Area (**Bologna Declaration, 1999**), it will be completed in 2010.
- The aim is harmonizing university systems in order to make them compatible in the European area and thus able to ensure the mobility of students and professionals.

Objectives of “Bologna Process”



Adoption of a system of comparable qualifications.

Adoption of a system based on two cycles: Grade cycle and Cycle Graduate

Promotion of mobility for teachers and students

Adaptation of the new ECTS (European Credit Transfer System)

Provide institutional arrangements

Promotion of measures to ensure quality

The “White paper in Information and Documentation” in Spain

In Spain, the Organic Law of Universities 2001, which was amended in 2007, establishes the desire for integration into the European Higher Education Area.

The "White Paper" presents the design of the new "title Degree" in Information and Documentation in Spain and has been evaluated positively by the National Agency for Assessment and Accreditation of Quality (ANECA) in 2004.

•**TOTAL CREDITS 240 (100%)**

•**COMPULSORY CREDITS: 156 (65%)**

•**OPTIONAL CREDITS BY UNIVERSITY:
24-36 (between 10-15% less)**

•**OPTIONAL CREDITS IN GENERAL:
48-60 (between 20-25% maximum)**


LEVEL FOR EACH EXPERTIZE:


Level 1: Awareness.
